#### **CARROT SMOOTHIE FOR KIDS**

- 1 cup milk (nondairy milk preferred)
- 1 cup frozen mango cubes
- 1 small clementine (peeled)
- 1 cup peeled and grated\* carrots
- Optional: 1 tablespoon almond butter rolled oats, and/or hemp seeds
- Optional: ¼ cup plain or vanilla Greek yogurt

\*Use grated carrots since they are easier to blend very smooth. You can use chopped carrots, but let the blender run until smooth to avoid choking hazards for young children.

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

 Add the milk, mango, clementine, and carrots to a blender. Add any optional ingredients.

#### NC PRE-K APPLICATIONS FOR THE 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR

We are getting excited about the upcoming school year! NC Pre-K Applications for the 2023-2024 school year are available starting April 3rd!!! Families can pick up a hard copy of the application and submit it in person at at 107 W. Front St Lillington, NC or 170 Pine State St in Lillington. They can also access and submit the application through our online portal by visiting www.harnettsmartstart.org. Check out our video to meet the NC Pre-K staff and get detailed information about applications.

When submitting the application please remember to attach all supporting documents. The application cannot be processed until we have the completed application, the child's birth certificate, proof of residence, and income verification (1 month of paystubs or tax document). Be sure to initial each item on page 4!

#### A FEW THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT NC PRE-K

- Your child must be 4 by August 31st.
- Lowest income applicants will be placed first. NC Pre-K is not first come first serve basis.
- The first round of placements will be made in July via mail. Applications submitted by June will be included in this round of placements.
- Families must provide transportation to and from this program.

# PLAY IS FUN. PLAY IS LEARNING.



























Ready to Grow Playgroup facilitates developmentally appropriate playgroups for children and caregivers who reside in Harnett County. Eligible children must be between the ages of birth through 5 years old. Playgroup facilitators use Kaleidoscope Play & Learn Curriculum to provide hands on activities that focus on early literacy and social emotional competency. Caregivers learn about the purpose of play and will connect with other parents during group time. Children and caregivers will participate in coordinated group activities to prepare the children for success in school.

# **READY TO GROW PLAYGROUP**



#### THEME OF THE MONTH:

Sort It Out

#### **KEY MESSAGE**

- 1. Identifying attributes and sorting objects based on similar attributes are important skills that will help children enter preschool or kindergarten prepared. Attribute: What something looks like Sort: To group based on being similar or alike in some way (color, shape, size, texture, etc.)
- 2. Learning about sorting can easily be worked into everyday activities. We sort all the time in our daily livessorting laundry, sorting dishes, etc. Learning to identify sorting in the environment is an important math connection skill.
- 3. We can help children learn how to sort based on different attributes by talking with them about what different attributes we see. We may talk about the color, shape, size, or texture of objects to help children identify different attributes.

#### **KEY MESSAGE CONTINUED**

- 4. Children are naturally curious, so we can help guide that curiosity by providing tools and the language to match it. Self-talk and parallel talk can be used to encourage children to understand sorting.
- Self-Talk: Putting words to our thinking process and modeling how we understand sorting. For example, when sorting laundry we can say, "I am going to put all the black clothes in a pile. This shirt is black, so it goes in the black pile."
- Parallel-Talk: Putting words to the child's actions. For example, as a child lines up toy cars by color we can say, "I notice that you are lining up your cars by color. You put all the green cars together, and all the red cars together, and all the blue cars together- you sorted your cars by color!"

# **GRUPO DE JUEGOS LISTO PARA CRECER**

#### **TEMA DEL MES:**

Clasificar

#### **MENSAJES CLAVE:**



- 1. La identificación de atributos y la clasificación de objetos en función de atributos similares son habilidades importantes que ayudarán a los niños a ingresar preparados al preescolar o al jardín de infantes.
- Atributo: cómo se ve algo
- Ordenar: agrupar en función de ser similar o similar de alguna manera (color, forma, tamaño, textura, etc.)

  2. El aprendizaje de la clasificación puede integrarse fácilmente en las actividades cotidianas. Clasificamos todo el tiempo en nuestra vida diaria: clasificar la ropa, clasificar los platos, etc. Aprender a identificar la clasificación en el entorno es una habilidad de conexión matemática importante.
- 3. Podemos ayudar a los niños a aprender a clasificar según diferentes atributos hablando con ellos sobre los diferentes atributos que vemos. Podemos hablar sobre el color, la forma, el tamaño o la textura de los objetos para ayudar a los niños a identificar diferentes atributos.

## **MENSAJE CLAVE CONTINUACIÓN:**

- 4. Los niños son curiosos por naturaleza, por lo que podemos ayudarlos a guiar esa curiosidad brindándoles herramientas y el lenguaje que la iguale. El diálogo interno y el diálogo paralelo se pueden usar para alentar a los niños a comprender la clasificación.
- Interno: poner palabras a nuestro proceso de pensamiento y modelar cómo entendemos la clasificación. Por ejemplo, al clasificar la ropa podemos decir: "Voy a poner toda la ropa negra en una pila. Esta camisa es negra, así que va en la pila negra".
- Paralelo: Poner palabras a las acciones del niño. Por ejemplo, cuando un niño alinea los autos de juguete por color, podemos decir: "Me doy cuenta de que está alineando sus autos por color. Juntas todos los autos verdes, y todos los autos rojos y todos los autos azules, jordenaste tus autos por color!


