YOGA POSE OF THE MONTH - DOWNWARD DOG:



- Start out on all fours.
- Spread your fingers and press your palms flat onto the floor.
- Lift your hips, straighten your legs, and make an upside-down V shape.
- Send your heels gently to the ground.
- Relax your head and neck and look down between your feet.



Ready to Grow Playgroup facilitates developmentally appropriate playgroups for children and caregivers who reside in Harnett County. Eligible children must be between the ages of birth through 5 years old. Playgroup facilitators use Kaleidoscope Play & Learn Curriculum to provide hands on activities that focus on early literacy and social emotional competency. Caregivers learn about the purpose of play and will connect with other parents during group time. Children and caregivers will participate in coordinated group activities to prepare the children for success in school.

READY TO GROW PLAYGROUP

THEME OF THE MONTH:

Differences & Diversity

CAREGIVERS WILL LEARN:

How to expose infants and young children to differences and diversity and how to foster understanding about it.

KEY MESSAGE:

- 1. Children start becoming aware of differences related to race, ethnicity, gender, culture, families, and disabilities, etc. at a very young age. It is never too early to start developmentally appropriate conversations on these topics.
- 2. Caregivers can help guide the child they care for in their learning about differences and foster a comfortable space for exploration and questions.
- 3. There are many ways caregivers can turn everyday moments into teachable moments as it relates to teaching children about differences and diversity.



KEY MESSAGE CONTINUED:

- 4. General tips for caregivers:
 - Use facts and be honest. If you do not know something, admit it and say, "let's find out together."
 - Meet the child where they are and help them process their understanding and observations of differences. Ask questions like, "why do you think or say that?"
 - Be a role model. Lead by example and show tolerance and acceptance of differences so that children can learn from adults around them.
 - Children are very observant.
 Negative body language, facial expressions, language usage, and other cultural messages can aid in developing real prejudice when reinforced by biases that exist in society.
 - Attend cultural community events to enjoy and learn from.

GRUPO DE JUEGOS LISTO PARA CRECER

TEMA DEL MES:

Diferencias y diversidad

LOS CUIDADORES APRENDERÁN:

Cómo exponer a los bebés y niños pequeños a las diferencias y la diversidad y cómo fomentar la comprensión al respecto.

MENSAJES CLAVE:

- 1. Los niños comienzan a tomar conciencia de las diferencias relacionadas con la raza, el origen étnico, el género, la cultura, las familias y las discapacidades, etc. a una edad muy temprana. Nunca es demasiado temprano para comenzar conversaciones apropiadas para el desarrollo sobre estos temas.
- 2. Los cuidadores pueden ayudar a guiar al niño que cuidan en su aprendizaje sobre las diferencias y fomentar un espacio cómodo para la exploración y las preguntas.
- 3. Hay muchas maneras en que los cuidadores pueden convertir los momentos cotidianos en momentos de enseñanza en lo que se refiere a enseñar a los niños sobre las diferencias y la diversidad.



MENSAJES CLAVE:

- 4. Consejos generales para cuidadores:
 - Usa hechos y sé honesto. Si no sabes algo, admítelo y di: "averigüemos juntos".
 - Conozca al niño donde está y ayúdelo a procesar su comprensión y observaciones de las diferencias.
 Haz preguntas como: "¿Por qué piensas o dices eso?"
 - Ser un modelo para seguir. Lidere con el ejemplo y muestre tolerancia y aceptación de las diferencias para que los niños puedan aprender de los adultos que los rodean.
 - Los niños son muy observadores. El lenguaje corporal negativo, las expresiones faciales, el uso del lenguaje y otros mensajes culturales pueden ayudar a desarrollar prejuicios reales cuando se ven reforzados por prejuicios que existen en la sociedad.
 - Asistir a eventos culturales de la comunidad para disfrutar y aprender de ellos.
