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OCTOBER IS ALSO:

NATIONAL FIRE PREVENTION MONTH

October is National Fire Prevention Month and that means it's time for us all to take the precautionary steps to prevent dangerous and life-threatening fires. There are steps we should take to prevent a fire:

- <u>Install Smoke Alarms</u> Install smoke alarms on every level of your home, inside bedrooms and outside sleeping areas. Interconnect smoke alarms throughout the home. When one sounds, they all sound.
- <u>Test Smoke Alarms</u> Test smoke alarms at least once a month and replace batteries once a year or when the alarm "chirps" to tell you the battery is low. Replace any smoke alarm that is more than 10 years old.
- <u>Have a Home Fire Escape Plan</u> Make a home fire escape plan and practice it at least twice a year.
- <u>Keep Matches and Lighters Out of Reach</u> Keep matches and lighters up high, out of the reach of children, preferably in a cabinet with a child lock.
- <u>Watch Your Cooking</u> Stay in the kitchen when you are frying, grilling, or broiling food. If you must leave, even for a short time, turn off the stove.
- <u>Inspect Electrical Cords</u> Replace cords that are cracked, damaged, have broken plugs, or have loose connections.
- <u>Be Careful When Using Candles</u> Keep candles at least one foot from anything that can burn. Blow out candles when you leave the room or go to sleep.

SENSORY PROCESSING AWARENESS MONTH

During the month of October, Sensory Awareness Month takes place helping to increase identification of the symptoms of Sensory Processing Disorder (SPD), its diagnosis and treatment. During this time, parents, educators, therapists, and other caregivers come together to raise awareness of sensory processing, and how if affects not only children, but adults, every day.

INGREDIENTS

- 2 medium sweet potatoes
- Oil of choice (avocado oil is a good option)
- Sea salt

It's definitely possible to have a healthy Halloween with limited sugar. These sweet potato pumpkins are both festive and healthy and kids love them!

- Peel the sweet potatoes with a <u>vegetable peeler</u>.
- Slice the sweet potato into rounds. About 1/4 inch thick.
- Using a <u>sharp paring knife</u>, CAREFULLY cut out jack-o-lantern faces on each sweet potato round.
- Place them on a parchment lined baking sheet.
- Drizzle the sweet potatoes with oil then use your hands to make sure they're evenly coated.
- Add a sprinkle of salt and roast in the oven at 425 °F for 25-30 minutes.

READY TO GROW PLAYGROUP

THEME OF THE MONTH:

Fire Safety Month & Fire Evacuation

CAREGIVERS WILL LEARN:

How to create a fire evacuation plan and know what to do if they hear a smoke detector go off. Caregivers will be provided with resources on how to stay safe against fire and how to prevent a fire.

KEY MESSAGE:

- 1. It is important to create, share and practice our home evacuation plans with everyone that lives there.
- The evacuation plan does not have to be complicated or fancy. The most important thing is that everyone in the home knows where the exits are.
- 3. When creating your evacuation plan, include:
- 2 exit routes from each bedroom.





KEY MESSAGE CONTINUED:

• A designated and agreed upon meeting spot a safe distance away from the building where family members can gather.

4. Practice the evacuation plan regularly with your family and other people that live in or spend a lot of time in your home.


