October is National Fire Prevention Month and that means it's time for us all to take the precautionary steps to prevent dangerous and life-threatening fires. According to the National Fire Prevention Association, the winter months see an increase in home fires, deaths and injuries. When it comes to keeping our families and homes safe, there are many other steps we can take to prevent fires.

- Make sure smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors are working.
- Place a fire detector every level of the home and test them monthly. Replace batteries annually.
- Get a fire extinguisher and make sure it's not outdated. Most fire extinguishers have an expiration date. Place one on each floor of the house and in the garage, too.
- Have an escape plan and practice fire drills with your family. Have at least two ways to get out of the home and set a meeting place for everyone.

NATIONAL RSV AWARENESS MONTH

Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) Awareness Month is observed annually in October to raise awareness about RSV, a common respiratory virus that can cause serious illness, especially in young children and older adults. RSV is the leading cause of bronchiolitis and pneumonia in children under one year of age. RSV is highly contagious and spreads through contact with respiratory droplets from coughing or sneezing.

Prevention:

- 1. Wash hands well especially after being around someone who might have cold symptoms.
- 2. Clean surfaces and disinfect objects at home regularly.
- 3. Avoid large crowds during the cold and flu season.

Ready to Grow Playgroup facilitates developmentally appropriate playgroups for children and caregivers who reside in Harnett County. Eligible children must be between the ages of birth through 5 years old. Playgroup facilitators use Kaleidoscope Play & Learn Curriculum to provide hands on activities that focus on early literacy and social emotional competency. Caregivers learn about the purpose of play and will connect with other parents during group time. Children and caregivers will participate in coordinated group activities to prepare the children for success in school.
