




## FAMILY SPOTLIGHT: BOOZER FAMILY

### What are some of the most valuable things you've learned from other parents/caregivers in Circle of Parents (COP)?

"One of the most valuable lessons I have learned from people at COP are that all children and all families are different and have different needs, and that is ok and that it is ok to ask for help. Children and parents all learn and grow at their own pace, and that is ok too! Being able to ask a peer how they would handle a situation with their community or their child has been such a great resource to me."

### How does Circle of Parents help you cope with the challenges of parenting?

"The people I have met through COP have become some of my closest friends. I can ask them any question I may have about parenting. I can also lean on them as pillars of support when I am having a hard day, need help, or just want to "vent" frustrations and celebrate my victories. I don't have to pretend to be anyone but myself with the individuals I have met here. Having a community of people who truly accept who I am, and who my children are is truly special. Going to COP has helped me cope with some medical challenges with my children and find them a community where they are understood and supported in their learning and growth."

### Has being a part of Circle of Parents helped you feel less isolated as a parent? How so?

"Yes, COP has shown me that there are other people out there going through similar challenges as me. I started COP feeling a bit lost as a parent. My world felt crazy and hectic and was only getting more so as I became pregnant for the 3rd time in 4 years. COP gave me a safe place to relax and confide in my peers about how I felt. I often told other parents that COP was my "me time" in the chaos. I was able to come in, trust that my children would be engaged and cared for and lean on my peers to help guide me through any questions or concerns I had about my children."



### What would you say to someone who's considering joining a parent support group?

"DO IT! You will find a caring support group who you can talk to about anything and everything. Even if you don't want to talk, you can listen and learn from others. Parenting is hard. It's easier with support around you. I have met two of my best friends through the group. While our children range in age and gender, and we vary in age, we chat daily about our struggles and our victories, and it is great to have found them."

### What do your children enjoy most about the Kid's Circle portion of Circle of Parents and Ready to Grow Playgroups?

"My oldest son likes that there are always new toys to play with and enjoys playing with the facilitators. Watching him let his guard down and be authentically himself in that space is so much fun. My daughter likes to go to playgroup with her family and friends to play. She likes to read books with her friends and dance with Ms. Jordan, Mrs. Katie and Ms. Whitney. My youngest can't speak for himself, but I think he enjoys hanging out and playing with the facilitators as well. He has the opportunity to observe children his own age, explore the surroundings, and play with people besides his two older siblings."

Letras del Abecedario



## LOS CUIDADORES APRENDERÁN:

Que un paso en el aprendizaje de la lectura es aprender que las letras forman palabras escritas y representan sonidos en las palabras habladas.



## MENSAJES CLAVE:

1. Antes de aprender a leer, nuestros niños necesitan aprender sobre las letras del alfabeto y esas letras:
  - Tienen nombres
  - Verse diferentes entre sí cuando se escriben
2. Podemos ayudar a los niños a familiarizarse con las letras mediante la repetición y usando actividades agradables, como:
  - Leer libros del alfabeto que muestren la letra y que ayuden a los niños a practicar escuchar y decir el sonido que produce esa letra.

# READY TO GROW PLAYGROUP

## THEME OF THE MONTH:

Letters of the Alphabet



## CAREGIVERS WILL LEARN:

- That one step in learning to read is learning that letters make up written words and represent sounds in spoken words.

## KEY MESSAGES:

1. Before they learn to read, our children need to learn about the letters of the alphabet and that those letters:



- Have names
- Look different from each other when they are written

2. We can help children become familiar with letters through repetition and by using enjoyable activities such as:

- Reading alphabet books that show the letter and that help children practice hearing and saying the sound that letter makes.

# READY TO GROW

## GRUPO DE JUEGOS LISTO PARA CRECER

Ready to Grow Playgroup facilitates developmentally appropriate playgroups for children and caregivers who reside in Harnett County. Eligible children must be between the ages of birth through 5 years old. Playgroup facilitators use Kaleidoscope Play & Learn Curriculum to provide hands on activities that focus on early literacy and social emotional competency. Caregivers learn about the purpose of play and will connect with other parents during group time. Children and caregivers will participate in coordinated group activities to prepare the children for success in school.
